LOW FIRE

- S103 Red Clay**, Cone 06-2
 Low fire plastic terra-cotta body designed for the classroom. Traditional terra-cotta color at cone 06 oxidation, deeper brick red at cone 2.
- S104 Red Clay w/Grog**, Cone 06-4
 Versatile clay containing fine grog. Good for hand building, slab work and throwing.
- S105 White Clay**, Cone 06-04
 Plastic low fire smooth body. Good for classroom use with low fire, lead-free glazes.
- S105G White Clay w/Grog**, Cone 06-04
 Same as #105 with the addition of fine grog. Gives a toothy clay that many potters prefer.
- S239 Raku Clay**, Cone 04-6
 An open clay body specially formulated to withstand the thermal shock of Raku firing. Contains sand.
- S295 Raku Body w/Kyanite**, Cone 06
 Good for larger pieces. The addition of kyanite increases the strength of this body.
- S417 Red Earthenware Clay**, Cone 06-02
 A low fire body that contains fire clay and a small amount of fine grog. Good for Majolica technique. Superior throwing body.
- S528 Mocha Low Fire Clay**, Cone 04
 Light brown, very smooth body. Good with low fire glazes.

- S910-G Gray Self-Hardening Clay**
S910-R Red Self-Hardening Clay
 The 910 clays harden without firing.
 Not watertight.

MID-RANGE

- S112 Brown Clay**, Cone 4-6
 Plastic clay for wheel & modeling. Granular manganese gives speckled surface. Best color at cone 5. Good in reduction or oxidation.
- S200 Brown Clay**, Cone 4-6
 All purpose mid range clay. Orange-brown in reduction. Deep beige in oxidation. Contains fine grog.
- S213 Porcelain Clay**, Cone 6
 White body formulated for cone 6 firing. Plastic, throwable clay.
- S225 Brown Clay**, Cone 4-6
 Same characteristics as #112, but has no specks. Ideal for throwing and slab work.
- S266 Dark Brown Clay**, Cone 4-6
 Gives reduction-like dark brown color in electric kiln. Smooth and plastic. Good for all techniques.
- S365 Grolleg Porcelain**, Cone 6
 Same as #257 but formulated to fire at lower temperature.
- S420 Sculpture Clay**, Cone 2-6
 Our most heavily grogged body, formulated for sculpture. Sand colored at cone 6, off-white at cone 2.
- S509 Sandy White Clay**, Cone 6
 Light firing clay for tile and handbuilding. Can be thrown if potters prefer a toothy body. Contains sand.
- S547 Red Sculpture Clay**, Cone 2-6
 With fine & medium grog. Good for sculpture and tile making. Low absorption at cone 4-6.
- S553 Warm Buff Clay**, Cone 4-6
 Good for production work. Contains fire clay and fine grog.

- S101 Buff Clay**, Cone 02-9
 All purpose stoneware clay with a wide firing range for throwing and modeling. Buff color at low temp., soft gray at cone 9.
- S108 Red Clay w/Grog**, Cone 4-10
 High fire red clay w/med grog & sand for surface texture & minimal warping & cracking. For sculpture, slab or coil building.
- S119 Stoneware Clay**, Cone 6-10
 Contains coarse silica sand. Good for salt & wood firings. Natural earth colorants yield orange-brown at cone 4 reduction fire.
- S130 Porcelain Clay**, Cone 7-10
 A white firing, high temp. plastic body. Very fine white porcelain grog enhances strength & throwability.
- S153 Stoneware Clay**, Cone 6-10
 Soft warm beige in oxidation - rich gray brown in reduction. Responds well to all techniques. Excellent for potters and classroom use.
- S181 White Stoneware Body**, Cone 6-10
 Very smooth white stoneware body. Contains no fire clay.
- S182 White Stoneware Body**, Cone 6-10
 Near white plastic stoneware body. Good used with bright glazes.
- S182G White Stoneware Body w/Grog**, Cone 6-10
 Same as #182 with the addition of fine grog.
- S205 Stoneware Clay**, Cone 6-10
 Formulated for reduction firing. Muted brick red at cone 4, stone gray at cone 10. Contains fine grog.
- S257 Grolleg Porcelain**, Cone 8-10
 A porcelain body with a parian like quality. White and tight, translucent when thin. Contains no ball clay.
- S259 Stoneware Clay**, Cone 6-10
 Formulated to be similar to #153, but with richer color tones.
- S306 Brown Firing Clay**, Cone 6-10
 Smooth throwing body. Orange-brown in reduction. Muted orange to cone 4 oxidation. Gray at cone 10 oxidation.
- S308 Brooklyn Red Clay**, Cone 4-8
 Red stoneware body with sand and grog. Oxidation firing yields red at cone 4 and deep sand at cone 8.
- S507 Warm Brown Stoneware**, Cone 6-10
 Stoneware body contains sand. Reduction firing yields rich mottled orange-brown. More subdued mottling in higher oxidation firing.
